The day consisted of a short theory session outlining strategies to assist with good decision making in high pressure environments, the chain of command at a lifesaving level and how we fit into the larger scheme of emergency management.

# **Beach Safety**

Spring has arrived and it has brought some beautiful warm weather with it! If are planning to head down to the beach, remember to take care as the beach has many risks regardless of the time of year:

- 1 Lifesavers will be back on duty from 30th November, so where possible always swim between the red and yellow flags as this is the safest part of the beach.
- 2 If you're planning a beach trip before lifesavers are back on duty remember to always swim with a friend, as rescue services will not be readily available to assist you if required.
- 3 Beaches have many risks; remember to read all the signage at the beach entrance prior to entering the water to ensure you're aware of hazards (such as strong currents, rocks and unstable cliffs).
